

## Job's Daughters International Scholarship

*This award was established to encourage Grade 12 students from the Calgary Board of Education (CBE) or Calgary Catholic School District (CCSD) to pursue post-secondary education. Job's Daughters International's foundation is to teach life skills such as leadership, teamwork, community service, public speaking and self-confidence in a supportive environment, and to assist them in becoming the leaders of tomorrow. This award will be granted with a preference to students who identify as female and are members of Job's Daughters International; however, it is open to all students identifying as female registered in a CBE or CCSD school.*

<b>WHERE TENABLE:</b>	Calgary Board of Education (CBE) and Calgary Catholic School District (CCSD)
<b>FIELD OF STUDY:</b>	Unrestricted
<b>VALUE:</b>	\$1,500
<b>NUMBER:</b>	Two (2)
<b>ELIGIBILITY:</b>	<p>Open to students who identify as female, and are currently registered in a CBE or CCSD school. Candidates must be Canadian Citizens or Permanent Residents registered in Grade 12 and completing the requirements of a high school diploma that will qualify them for a post-secondary education.</p> <p>Open to recipients who will be attending an accredited Canadian institution offering a degree, diploma or certificate upon completion.</p> <p>Applicants are required to submit an original essay <b><u>describing their involvement in the community, clearly stating how leadership, along with teamwork, was implemented during all community service projects (with emphasis on volunteerism).</u></b> The essay must be no more than 500 words.</p> <p>Applicants must demonstrate a strong involvement in non-academic volunteer activities within the school and /or community and are requested to submit two (2) letters of reference, preferably from a school official or community leader representing a community-based organization who can attest to the applicant's volunteerism and overall suitability for the award. Preference will be given to active members of Job's Daughters International and/or those applicants with outstanding community service.</p>

<b>SELECTION &amp; PAYMENT:</b>	Selection will be based on essay, volunteerism and reference letters. Selection will be made by EducationMatters' volunteer Student Awards Selection Committee. Recipients will be notified by September. The recipient must be registered at an accredited Canadian institution within 6 months of the notification to claim the award. Payment is made directly to the post-secondary institution upon proof of registration.
