Enriching opportunities for Calgary's students

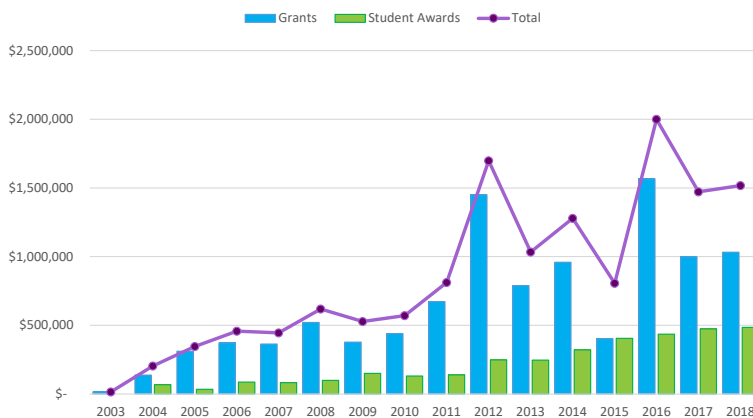

EducationMatters was established in 2003 by the Calgary Board of Education (CBE) Trustees, and community visionaries, to support innovative

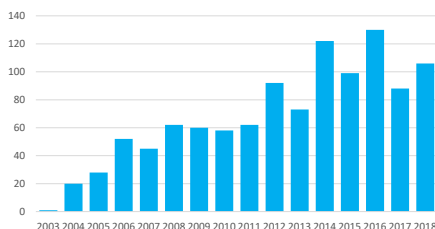
enhancement programs that help CBE students excel. Since then, we are proud to have engaged thousands of Calgarians in support of public education and now manage over 160 active funds.

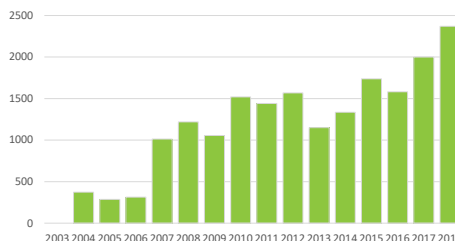
Grant and Student Award Disbursements

Mission

To promote and facilitate community engagement with public education, to enhance and enrich the education offered to all students – enabling them to fully realize their potential and become valued and contributing global citizens.

2018 Highlights:

- Distributed over **\$1.5 million**, including more than **\$1 million** in grants and almost **\$500,000** in student awards to support student development
- Received over **\$1.6 million** in donations

Since 2003, we have:

- Granted almost **\$14 million** in program grants and student awards
- Received almost **\$19 million** in gifts from donors
- Grown our endowment portfolio to more than **\$5 million**
